

NEW HEALTH OPTIONS FOR IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES



All Immigrants Can Use Healthplanfinder to Look for Coverage

U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals can use Healthplanfinder to buy health plans and see if they are eligible for low-cost or free coverage.

Immigrants who are “lawfully present” can use Healthplanfinder to buy health plans and see if they are eligible for low-cost coverage. Some lawfully present immigrants may also be eligible for free coverage.

Immigrants who are not “lawfully present” can still use Healthplanfinder to see if they are eligible for limited health coverage options. For example, pregnant women, children, and people who are very sick may still be eligible for coverage.



Why We Ask For Your Social Security Number or Immigrant Information When You Apply

With some exceptions described below, we need a Social Security Number (SSN) for yourself and everyone else in your household who uses Healthplanfinder to apply for health coverage. We can help you apply for a SSN if you don't have one.

Exceptions:

- ★ You do not have to provide a SSN for a person who is in your household, but not asking for health coverage for themselves.
- ★ If a person in your household does not have a SSN but wants health coverage for themselves, you can provide other information showing they are a US citizen, US national, or lawfully present immigrant. If you cannot provide this information, you should still include the person in your application because we need other information about them, like their income. They may also be eligible for more limited coverage.





We Protect Your Privacy

We use the information on your application to help decide eligibility and administer our health coverage programs.

We will keep all the information you provide private and secure. *We do not share your information with any immigration agency for the purpose of enforcement.*



Getting Help with Health Care Costs Will Not Put Your Citizenship or Immigration Status at Risk

In general, applying for health coverage or help with health coverage costs will not make you a “public charge”— that means it will not affect your immigration status, chances of becoming a lawful permanent resident (getting a “green card”), or becoming a naturalized citizen.

The only exception to this is if you receive long term care in a nursing home or other facility paid for by the government, or if you don’t tell the truth on your application.



You Can Get Help In Your Language
