Yes. A not-to-exceed amount for any ad hoc market analysis work will be identified at the time WAHBE requests such work. An hourly rate proposal MUST be included in Vendor proposals, but it is not scored. Per RFQQ HBE 19-001, Section 4.2.5.8. "Hourly Rates Proposal - Ad Hoc Market Analysis (Mandatory, Pass/Fail)", Vendor shall provide the title and hourly rates for each position that may perform ad hoc market analysis work throughout the term of a resulting Contract.

For the first year of the resulting Contract, WAHBE anticipates the ASV will be required to attend the initial standardized benefit plan design presentation to stakeholders. WAHBE anticipates no in-person meetings to be held for enrollment projection services. In addition, see WAHBE's response to question #11 below.

In addition, WAHBE has determined the need to formally procure the ongoing standardized benefit plan design services that are performed under the current Contract as an ad-hoc service.

Yes, as part of the standardized benefit plans design, WAHBE will require the Vendor to address compliance with these requirements.

For example, do you anticipate it will be done through questionnaires that the Contractor will develop? WAHBE will solicit feedback through a series of stakeholder meetings that coincide with development of the standardized benefit plan designs. It is WAHBE's expectation that the Vendor will participate in these meetings. In addition, see WAHBE's response to question #3 above.

Experience of the Enrollment Projections Team	Page 12	The last bullet in this section requests a list of relevant projects the key personnel have performed in that past three (3) years and asks for a brief description of two (2) of them, indicating that they be "preferably in Washington State." Section 4.2.5.3 includes similar reference to preference for Washington State experience. Please indicate what portion of the 15 points assigned to Sections 4.2.5.1 and 4.2.5.3 (as outlined in the table in Section 5.2.2) are related to having prior experience performing these same services specifically in Washington. In otherwords, if a bidder had significant experience performing these services would their score differ depending upon whether this experience was in Washington State or not?	Although WAHBE prefers the Vendor to identify its projects and experience that took place in Washington State, this is not a requirement. Points will be awarded based on the overall experience and qualifications of the Vendor and not the location.
