

Are You Eligible for Health Insurance?

A Quick Guide for Immigrants and Refugees

More people are getting free or low-cost health insurance than ever before.

It's safe to sign up.

Facts about you and your family cannot be used against you for immigration enforcement reasons. What you share is private. It will only be used to find out if you can sign up for a health plan.

Find out if you're eligible.

- People with many different immigration statuses may now be able to sign up for health coverage:
 - People who have been in the U.S. less than 5 years
 - Pregnant women and children under the age of 19 (including those who are undocumented)
 - People with work and student visas

Gather your documents.

Some basic facts about you are needed to find out if you can sign up for health coverage. You cannot be denied a health plan because of the immigration status of others in your family.



DOCUMENTS YOU MAY NEED

- Social Security Numbers (SSN) or immigration papers
- Pay stubs or a W-2 form
- Health plan cards or plan numbers for each person in your family who already has health coverage
