Background

Washington Healthplanfinder Applicants <139% FPL

The expansion of health coverage through *Washington Healthplanfinder* began Nov. 1 2023, when those without a federally recognized immigration status were first able to start shopping for private health and dental insurance for 2024. This expansion is possible through a federally approved 1332 Waiver.

Report

This report includes data as of Jan. 18, 2024, on the immigrant health coverage (IHC) expansion population (those newly eligible to purchase private coverage under the 1332 Waiver), and focuses on applicants under 139% of the federal poverty level (FPL), who have not yet signed up for a qualified health plan.

This group is income-eligible for the upcoming Washington Apple Health Expansion noted below. Applicants who are eligible for the upcoming Apple Health Expansion will need to take action to enroll in that program when it becomes available. Enrollment will be limited to the state funding allocated (learn more about the Apple Health Expansion Enrollment Cap).

A report on all IHC customers who signed up for health and dental insurance is available on the Exchange's corporate website. Among those who have signed up for coverage, those under 139% who are eligible for the upcoming Apple Health Expansion will be transitioned to that program when it becomes available.

Community Outreach and Engagement

Washington Health Benefit Exchange (Exchange) is working in partnership with the Health Care Authority (state Medicaid agency) and affected community members and partners to support outreach and engagement for the upcoming Apple Health Expansion.

Upcoming Washington Apple Health Expansion

Apple Health coverage, without premiums or copays, is also being expanded through Washington Healthplanfinder to Washingtonians who are age 19 or older, with an annual income under 139% of the federal poverty level and who do not qualify for other Apple Health programs based on immigration status.

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Open-Enrollment Toplines Washington Healthplanfinder Applicants <139% FPL

Overall, about a quarter of the approximately 100,000 people who are uninsured and undocumented in Washington state have applied for health coverage through Washington Healthplanfinder since Nov. 1, 2023, when coverage was expanded for 2024.

 About 16,200 (68%) of the 24,000 people who have applied since Nov. 1, 2023, have an income below 139% FPL (\$1,732 monthly or \$20,784 annually for a single person household).



Among IHC applicants under 139% FPL, over 76% report being non-White, and over 90% report being Hispanic.






IHC applicants <139% FPL by age

Language Assistance

The top languages among IHC applicants under 139% FPL are Spanish; Portuguese; French; Somali; Chinese; Korean; Albanian; Romanian; Russian; Arabic; Tigrigna; and Punjabi.

Chart (at right) displays languages with 10 or more requests through the online *Washington Healthplanfinder* application.

Language assistance is also provided by assisters, multilingual and bilingual Customer Service Representatives at the Customer Support Center, and through telephonic interpretation that supports more than 200 languages.

Apple Health Expansion coming July 2024

What is Apple Health Expansion?

The 2022 supplemental budget directs the Health Care Authority (HCA) to develop a medical assistance program that would provide Medicaid equivalent health care coverage to uninsured adults who do not meet the immigration requirements for federal assistance.

Who is eligible?

You may be eligible for this program if you:

- Are a Washington resident age 19 or older,
- · Have countable income under 138% of the federal poverty level,
- · Do not qualify for other Apple Health programs based on immigration status,
- . Are not pregnant or did not have a pregnancy end in the last 12 months, and
- Are not eligible for qualified health plans with advance premium tax credits (APTC) or federally funded medical assistance programs.

You can start applying for Apple Health Expansion Spring 2024.

When does coverage start?

Apple Health Expansion coverage begins July 1, 2024.
